Salcey Forest is about 7 miles SE of Northampton. Parking and forest entrance are on Wooton Road, Northamptonshire.


By Public Transport: The nearest bus stop is in Hartwell, which is approximately a 20-minute walk from Salcey Forest.

By Road: Leave the M1 at junction 15 and take the A45 towards Northampton. Take the slip road marked Wootton and take the 1st exit on the roundabout to cross over the A45. Go straight across the next roundabout, following signs for Quinton. At the next roundabout take the 3rd turning onto Wootton Road. Follow this road through Quinton Village and continue to Salcey. Ignore signs to visitor car park after 800 metres on the left (after the kennels) and continue to the signed event parking on the right 200 m further on.

Event Parking for participants vehicles, including camper vans, is in the "overflow" car park on the opposite side of Wooton Road from the forest. Please do not park in any of the forest-side car parks unless instructed to do so by an event marshall. Parking is not exclusive to the event and must be shared with other users of the forest (For example, there is a Parkrun at Salcey on Saturday mornings).

The normal FE car parking charges apply (see Salcey Forest website). All-day parking fee is currently £6 (up to 2 hours is £4). Payment can be made via the RingGo App.

Space is restricted so please car share wherever possible.



Start, Finish, and all facilities are on the forest side of the road. No courses involve road crossings.

The road crossing (Wooton Road) between the car park and the forest will be marshalled from approx. 10:30 am until approx. 2pm. You are responsible for your own safety when crossing this road. Please use taped routes – do not walk along the road!

Registration and Download will be adjacent to the café, toilets and visitor centre. First Aid post and CompassPoint mobile shop will also be set up at this location.



Finish: Finish is located about 500m walk from Download. Please remember to go download as soon as you have finished. No water will be provided at the finish.

Registration will be open from 10:30 until 11:55 for Hire dibber collection, Enquiries, Entry on the Day for White, Yellow & Orange courses, and sale of Gruffalo course maps.

Facilities

Indoor toilets and cafe are available near registration and download.

The Grounds cafe provides snacks (e.g. sandwiches/toasties) and hot & cold drinks.

Salcey Forest is home to a Gruffalo trail. Trail maps can be obtained from registration - cost £1.50.

CompassPoint mobile shop will be in attendance selling orienteering related gear.

Starts

Start times for pre-entries will be pre-allocated and displayed on the Fabian4 site in advance of the event, after entries have closed. It is a punching start and the start and finish must be punched even if using a SIAC dibber. Late arrivals at the start will be started as soon as possible, but if you miss your allocated start time you may have a long wait before you can be slotted in. Loose control descriptions will be provided in the start lanes. One SIAC battery check unit will be provided at the start, and another at registration. A Start official will carry out an SI dibber check – this is important to ensure SIAC cards are switched on.

We will be using sport demiclectronic punching. Beacon mode will be enabled for all numbered controls. Start and Finish controls will require contact punching by all competitors.

Entries

https://www.fabian4.co.uk with entries closing at midnight on 20th February. White, Yellow and Orange courses are available to enter on the day. There will no entry on the day for the remaining courses.

Map and Terrain:

There is an area of felling happening before the event. This will be marked as OOB on course maps. Adjacent tracks can be used but will be rough. Please keep away from any forestry machinery. Full leg cover is mandatory.

Map is 1:10000, 5m contours and A4 size. Course maps and loose control descriptions will be printed on waterproof paper. Control descriptions for courses Brown to Blue will be printed on the back of the map. All other courses will have control descriptions on the front.

Safety:

- Please do not go into any area marked as Out of Bounds, indicated on the map by either solid olive colour, or vertical purple stripes or cross hatching
- There may be cyclists and pedestrians in the forest. Please be aware and do not obstruct.
- You take part in this event at your own risk and are responsible for your own safety. Full leg cover is compulsory and you are advised to carry a whistle.
- In extreme weather conditions, cagoules may be declared obligatory and signs will be on display at assembly if this is so.
- Dogs are welcome but must be kept under close control at all times in accordance with FE policy, and must be on leads in the car park area and when crossing roads.
- Competitors take part at their own risk and are responsible for their own safety.

Please clean shoes before the event to avoid spread of plant-based diseases.

Results: Live results will be uploaded to the WAOC website during the event - see www.waoc.org.uk/results. Final results will also appear here, and will be uploaded to the British Orienteering website and to the UKOL database.

First aid: First aid cover will be provided by White Star Medical, who will be based near enquiries and download.

Travel directions to the nearest hospital with A&E facilities will be available at registration/download.
