Minutes from AGM 2016

Minutes from the 2016 meeting were accepted by the attendees.

Chairmans Report - Peter Woods

Club accounts remain stable, and our membership levels are similar to previous years. Current figures are - 96 units (56 of these are families) 138 adults / 50 juniors.

WAOC contributed to events for non-orienteers last year, which had not gleaned many new starters, so this year we aimed to run more events for orienteers - we have contributed to this well over the last year. Some main achievements include - joint effort last May with DRONGO, masterminded on the WAOC side by Helen Bickle, to lay on the Science City Races – with two separate urban sprint races on the same day. This was very popular: attracting over 300 entries, and the feedback was overwhelmingly positive in regard to the courses, the nature of the event, and attention to detail.

Our events at Mildenhall and Maulden both attracted very high turnouts. ATC & Happy Hearts both used this event for their club championships. Others worthy of a mention include - 2 day Icenian with CUOC, level D events at Cambourne, Wimpole & Ampthill.

I am proud of the high standards of our events, and our key officials: Organisers, Planners, and Controllers should be recognised as being qualified to lay on events of level B standard. So in future we will endeavour to lay on a level B event every year or two

British Orienteering added a section to its website to give better coverage of Permanent Orienteering Courses. Stephen Borrill has taken on the role of managing the WAOC POCs on this website.

Thank you to Jenny, who has put together our submission to renew our Clubmark status, something which has to be done every 4 years

New WAOC club kit - this has been taken up well by club members and it is great to see so many in the new kit. A sample club waterproof jacket is currently being designed and views of club members will be sought.

Captains Report - Graham Louth

Good attendance at events, members of WAOC participated in all of the major events over the year - Janet Cronk has attended the most, so well done!

Still low numbers attending - we used to be able to fill the tunnel tent. We now have a smaller green "pop up" tent for the JK.

27 attended the JK last year – congratulations to Rob Campbell and Ursula Oxburgh on being second in their classes in the sprints on Good Friday and to Ursula for being 2nd overall in the W80 class, and Guro Harstad for coming 4th overall in the W40L class with a 3rd & 4th on the two forest days.

We had 3 teams competing in the relay on Easter Monday with Andrew Henderson, Mike Bickle and Peter Haynes best placed, achieving a credible 19th in the Mens Vet Class.

Guro ran even better at the British Long Champs in the West Midlands, coming first in the W40L and becoming British champion.

There were also notable results from the Wetherill Family at the Southern Champs in the New Forest; Guro and Ursula at the British Sprint Champs at the Olympic Park; and Rob Campbell and Janet Cronk being crowned Midland Champions; with Dil Wetherill and David Cronk also worthy of a mention for their 3rd places.

No relay team at the British Champs for the second year running unfortunately. We also had a depleted Junior team for the Yvette Baker trophy qualifier and a depleted team for the compass Sport Qualifier at Ashridge – thank you to those who competed for WAOC. Best performance was from Rob Campbell who came first on the Blue course.

A reminder that the British long distance champs will be in the Lake District in May – you have until 9th April to enter.
